Giving

Money seems to be a taboo subject in the Church. It's always on our minds, it's essential to getting by in life, and yet we can't talk about it in Church.

Yet in the bible there are 12,350 verses that speak of money and possessions, 800 on personal finances, 500 on prayer, less than 500 on faith. Of Jesus' 38 parables 16 were concerned with how to handle money and possessions. In the Gospels, an amazing 1 of 10 verses (288 in all) deal directly with the subject of money! The only thing Jesus talks about more than money is the Kingdom of God.

So, Jesus and the bible in general, teach us that our attitude towards money and possessions have a profound impact on our spiritual lives, our following of Jesus.

In doing so Jesus invested everything into his mission. As his Body, his Bride, we are called to invest everything that we are,
