So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.' He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'

"When I ran, that was my time to talk to God"

When Daphyne started running, she hoped it would help her feel better physically and mentally.

She was overweight and borderline diabetic, a single mother working full time while caring for two daughters and her terminally-ill mother. She had to do something.


Running fulfilled her hopes a thousand times over, but she didn't anticipate what turned out to be its biggest benefit of all: It brought her closer to God. "When I ran, that was my time to talk to God," says Jackson, now 53.

"I could feel the spirit. It was so freeing. I could pray. I could just talk to God like I was talking to you. If I needed to cry, I could cry. If I needed to scream, I could scream. I could do anything." A dozen marathons later, Daphyne's relationship with running and with God continues. If she's not listening to gospel music during those miles, she's streaming her church's sermons or she's praying.

And while a strong faith won't necessarily make you healthier, nor a healthy body make you more faithful, the two are as woven together as ribbon through a braid.

When Daphyne is encouraging people to take care of themselves, she tells them that in the Bible "our body is a temple. We should take care of the temple. God loves us like he loves the church, and if we are a temple, we are the church so you have to take care of yourself."

"We're physical beings and we are here on a physical planet. What more can we offer to God than allowing ourselves to pay attention to our



physical selves by action, by movement, by learning?"

As for Daphyne, she continues to seek and to hold tight to spirituality with every mile, every hill, ever pothole and sunset.

"Every time I step out on a course, I'm stepping out on faith," she says. "That first step on the starting line, I pray and my prayer is, 'Let thy will be done."
